IMPORTANT REGULATORY REQUIREMENT (please forward to appropriate personnel)

2009 Hazardous Waste Report – Please read all sections carefully

You are receiving this package because you have indicated to the Georgia Environmental Protection Division (EPD), through the notification process, that your site is a Large Quantity Generator (LQG) of hazardous waste and/or a hazardous waste treatment, storage or disposal (TSD) facility. Enclosed in this package are the 2009 Hazardous Waste Report Instructions and Form booklet, instructions for a simplified electronic filing method via the Internet of the 2009 Hazardous Waste Report, a certification form for those who may not be required to file the forms for 2009, and the 2010 Waste Reduction Plan Instructions and Forms. The following is a discussion of what is required for both reports.

2009 Hazardous Waste Report

Under authority of the Georgia Hazardous Waste Management Act (Act) and the Georgia Rules for Hazardous Waste Management (Rules), all sites meeting the definition of a Large Quantity Generator or a Treatment, Storage or Disposal facility during 2009 must report their hazardous waste activities during 2009. **If applicable, you must complete and return the Hazardous Waste Report to EPD by March 1, 2010.** An extension can be requested. However, no extensions will be given beyond April 1, 2010. Contact the Hazardous Waste Management Branch in writing to request an extension.

Page 2 of the 2009 Hazardous Waste Report Instructions and Form booklet contains a discussion regarding who must file the 2009 Hazardous Waste Report. Read this section carefully to determine whether your site is required to complete and submit this report. If you determine that you are not required to file, fill out the enclosed certification form and return to EPD by March 1, 2010. If you indicate that your status has changed permanently, you must complete a subsequent RCRA Subtitle C Site Identification Form (Form 8700-13A/B) contained as part of the form booklet to change our records. Please keep in mind that there are substantial potential penalties, including fine and imprisonment, for failure to file or for filing a false report.

As in prior reporting years, the State of Georgia has provided a version of the 2009 Hazardous Waste Report for simplified electronic filing. Access to the electronic software is provided to you free of charge via the Internet. Please see the attached Electronic Report Filing enclosure for instructions on how to utilize this easy to use software. The software makes code selection easier and performs edit checks to insure proper completion of the forms. You are strongly encouraged to make use of this simple method for filing your 2009 Hazardous Waste Report. Please remember to **return a printed copy of the Site Identification Form with an original signature of responsible official if you file electronically.**

There is also another method for electronic filing which utilizes ASCII flat file formats, which many companies have used in the past to format data from their own database management systems. Georgia EPD does not require Form OI be completed. Also, Georgia has not adopted regulations regarding Hazardous Secondary Material Activity; therefore, the Addendum to the Site Identification Form for this activity should not be completed for Georgia facilities at this time. Remember to keep copies of your completed Report for your files. Sites are required by the Rules to retain copies of their Reports for three years.

2010 Waste Reduction Plans

Under authority of the Georgia Hazardous Waste Management Act (Act), LQGs shall develop hazardous waste reduction plans, submit such plans to the Director, submit biennially a hazardous waste reduction progress report, and set forth any amendments to the plan. TSD facilities are not required to file these reports unless they are also Large Quantity Generators.

Instructions for Filing the Hazardous Waste Reduction Plan:

- Read the enclosed instructions carefully and complete all applicable forms. The forms are available in Microsoft Word format, to assist those wishing to complete on their computer, from EPD's web site at http://www.gaepd.org/Documents/epdforms_hwb.html under Hazardous Waste Management: Waste Reduction Plan
- Make a copy of your report for your files before mailing.
- Return the completed forms along with your 2009 Hazardous Waste Report to EPD **no later than March 1, 2010.**
- Failure to submit the report, if required, may subject you to enforcement action as provided for in the Act.

If your status as a hazardous waste generator or any other information about your facility has changed, you must file a subsequent RCRA Subtitle C Site Identification Form (Form 8700-13A/B, a.k.a. -12), contained as part of the forms booklet, to change our records. Be sure to mark that it is to provide Subsequent Notification if it is not being filed as a part of the Hazardous Waste Report. If you no longer generate hazardous waste and no longer require an EPA Identification Number but were required to submit the 2009 Hazardous Waste Report because you were a LQG or TSD during any part of 2009, please send a letter to our office requesting the deactivation of that number and state the reasons why along with the report. The certification form for sites not required to file the 2009 Hazardous Waste Report for the reasons stated will also serve to deactivate your ID number when marked accordingly.

Please remember that March 1, 2010, is the deadline for submitting your 2009 Hazardous Waste Report and 2010 Waste Reduction Plan. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
