NOTICE OF DRAFT PSD/TITLE V PERMIT AMENDMENT

To All Interested Persons and Parties

Quebecor World KRI Inc. (Quebecor World) proposes to construct and operate one publication rotogravure printing press at its existing publication printing facility located at 4301 Evans to Locks Road, Evans, Georgia (Columbia County). Volatile organic compounds (VOCs) emitted from the operation of the new press will be captured by a permanent total enclosure and controlled by an existing carbon adsorption/solvent recovery system. Quebecor World has filed an application with the Environmental Protection Division (EPD) for an air quality permit to construct and operate this new printing press.

The only regulated air pollutant to be emitted in significant amounts as a result of this modification will be VOCs, which can react to form ozone in the air. The Columbia County area is currently in attainment with NAAQS of 0.12 parts per million for ozone. EPD has concluded that the proposed modification will not adversely affect air quality, with regard to ozone. The operation of the new press is expected to result in significant emissions of toxic pollutants into the atmosphere. Almost all the increases in the toxic pollutant emissions are the VOCs from the printing process. EPD has considered air toxics control in its analyses of Best Available Control Technology (BACT) and ambient air quality impact.

EPD has concluded that Quebecor World's application should be approved and that a PSD/Title V Permit Amendment should be granted for the proposed project. This conclusion is based upon evidence that the proposed project, when completed, will comply with the Division's Rules for Air Quality Control, Chapter 391-3-1; that the emissions from the facility will not cause or contribute to a violation of any applicable National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) or Federal Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) regulations, 40 CFR 52.21, including the use of BACT for regulated pollutants.

You are hereby notified of the opportunity for written public comments concerning the application for an Air Quality Permit to construct and operate the new press and the EPD's Preliminary Determination concerning the application. The Preliminary Determination is a summary of the technical review of the application and contains a copy of the Company's application, other supporting information submitted by the applicant, and a draft PSD/Title V Permit Amendment.

The Preliminary Determination and the draft PSD/Title V Permit Amendment is available for public review during normal business hours at the following locations: (1) EPD office, 4244 International Parkway, Suite 120, Atlanta, Georgia; and (2) EPD's website at <http://www.air.dnr.state.ga.us/sspp/psd/main.htm>. Persons wishing to comment on the Preliminary Determination and/or the draft PSD/Title V Permit Amendment are invited to submit their comments in writing to the EPD at the above Atlanta address, postmarked no later than 30 days after the

date of publication in this newspaper. All comments postmarked on or prior to that date will be considered by the Division in making its final decision on the Permit Amendment.

Representatives from EPD will be available to discuss Quebecor World's application for the Air Quality permit to construct and operate the new press during the public meeting. Following the public meeting, a hearing will be held to receive formal comments on Quebecor World's application. At the public hearing, anyone may present data, make a statement, comment or offer a viewpoint or argument, either orally or in writing. At that hearing, anyone may present data, make a statement or comment, or offer a viewpoint or argument either orally or in writing concerning the draft permit. During the Division's decision-making procedures to issue the draft permit, any information received during a public hearing will be considered together with information received during the comment period.

Following this 30 day public comment period, the draft PSD/Title V Permit Amendment will undergo a 45 day review by U.S. EPA in accordance with 40 CFR 70.8. Information pertaining to U.S. EPA's review period can be found on their website at www.epa.gov/region4/air/permits.

After all the comment periods have expired and the public hearing has been held, the EPD will consider all the comments received and issue a Final Determination relative to the facility's application. If the Final Determination upholds EPD's conclusion in the Preliminary Determination that Quebecor World's application should be approved and that the PSD/Title V Permit Amendment should be granted, EPD will issue a final PSD/Title V Permit Amendment with any necessary revisions based on the comments received during the comment period(s). Copies of the EPD Final Determination, comments received, EPD's responses to comments, the final PSD/Title V Permit Amendment and any other relevant information will then be made available for public review during normal business hours at the office of the Air Protection Branch and/or at the internet address given above.

A summary of the comments received, EPD's responses to the comments and any changes made to the draft PSD/Title V Permit Amendment will be found in an addendum to PSD Permit and Title V Significant Modification Application Review. A copy of this review will be added to the information already available at the locations given above.
