

Summary of the Revisions to the “Procedures for Calculating Air Permit Fees”

The following is a summary of the differences between the 2009 and 2010 version of the Procedures for Calculating Air Permit Fees. (Note: the 2010 version is dated January 31, 2010.) The complete 2010 procedures manual, showing changes from the 2009 using strikeout and underline, can be obtained at <http://environet.dnr.state.ga.us/1>.

- The dollar-per-ton rate remains the same as the 2009 rate for all sources except coal-fired electric generating units: \$34.00 per ton.
- The dollar-per-ton rate for coal-fired electric generating units is set at \$35.84 per ton. The fee calculation methodology for coal-fired electric generating units is now specified in new section 3.21b.
- The Part 70 minimum fee is increased from \$3800 to \$4100.
- The Synthetic Minor fee is increased from \$1500 to \$1700.
- The NSPS fee remains the same: \$1500.
- Language has been added to clarify that sources that have been issued a permit but not begun construction are subject to permit fees.
- The provisions for when Part 70 and NSPS fees are no longer applicable for sources that have ceased operation and had their permit revoked have been revised so as to be consistent with the requirement for synthetic minor sources.
- Sources that are subject to the generic synthetic minor air quality permit for asphalt plants are subject to the synthetic minor fee.
